A Update on Visitation Policies

Dear Residents, Families, and Staff:

I hope everyone is healthy and safe.

Please see listed below, some updates to our visitation policies for Mariann Home.

Outdoor visitations will have re-opened. For further questions/ inquiries around outdoor visits please contact Shannon O'Connor, Life Enrichment Director, via telephone or by email.

Mask Mandate Changes: The Ministry has implanted universal Masking mandate for LTC homes. Visitors are strongly encouraged to wear a mask when in the facility. It will be up to the digression of the individual (family member) if they wish to wear one or not. For further inquiries please call the home to speak to either Bernard Boreland (Administrator) or Erly Valera (DOC).

Indoor visitations are no longer required to be scheduled as of April 1st, 2023. Doors will open for visitation from **8:00am-8:00pm**, after 8:00pm the doors will be locked, and doorbell will need to be used. The Ministry has removed all active screeners as of April 1st, 2023. Visitors will be required to perform passive screening and answer 3 questions prior to coming in for visit. Universal masking is NO longer required throughout entire facility, unless you wish to wear one or loved one is on isolation. All, **Leave of Absence approvals** are to be arranged through the charge nurse on your loved one's floor.

Mariann Home has upgraded the security and now have a pin pad instead of the red release button located at the parking lot entrance to gain entrance to the building. Please note the code is the same as the exit code to leave the building.

Dining: If you would like to feed your loved one, please contact Michele Schuyler for further information as training is required.

Hepa filters have been installed in all common areas in the facility.
